The new schedule will also ensure more direct flights, with fewer stops, directly benefiting our Elders and medical travelers. For those living in the Hamlets we serve, this change will also increase the capacity in and out of their communities. On top of it all, there will be an increased cargo capacity for our customers with the introduction of the ATR 72F freighter.
