

NUNAVIK TRAVEL CHECKLIST

If you are travelling to and from Nunavik, you must do these 4 things before your trip.

This information is subject to change without notice. Please check with the [Kativik Regional Government](#), the [Nunavik Regional Board of Health and Social Services \(NRBHSS\)](#), the [Province of Québec](#) and the [Government of Canada](#) for the most current information.

Check for updated information from Regional Health Authorities

- Visit the [Nunavik Regional Board of Health and Social Services](#) website and confirm you are eligible to travel.
Inuit beneficiaries of the James Bay and Northern Quebec Agreement, patients travelling for medical appointments, essential workers, people travelling back home or for humanitarian reasons may enter Nunavik from the South.
- All travellers entering Nunavik from the South will be required to be tested twice - before travelling and then 7 days after arrival.
- [Travellers must quarantine for 14 days](#) before or after arriving in Nunavik or a combination of both, even if their COVID test results are negative.

Obtain a Nunavik Territory Access Authorization

- All travellers entering into Nunavik must have a Nunavik Territory Access Authorization (NTAA) from the NRBHSS.
- To receive this letter, complete the [Nunavik COVID Health Survey](#) after you make a booking .

Be prepared to wear a face mask throughout the flight

- Only procedural masks (blue with 3-ply) are permitted for use to board and throughout a flight. No other masks will be permitted. The procedural face masks are available at the boarding gate for all passengers aged 12 years and older.
