NUNAVIK TRAVEL CHECKLIST

If you are travelling to and from Nunavik, you must do these 5 things before your trip.

This information is subject to change without notice. Please check with the <u>Kativik Regional Government</u>, the <u>Nunavik</u> <u>Regional Board of Health and Social Services (NRBHSS)</u>, the <u>Province of Québec</u> and the <u>Government of Canada</u> for the most current information.

1	 Confirm you are eligible to travel Visit the <u>Nunavik Regional Board of Health and Social Services</u> website and confirm you are eligible to travel to Nunavik.
2	 Obtain a Nunavik Territory Access Authorization & Get Tested All eligible travellers entering into Nunavik must have a Nunavik Territory Access Authorization (NTAA) from the Nunavik Regional Board of Health and Social Services. To receive this letter, you must complete the <u>Nunavik Travel Authorization & Quarantine Plan</u> after you make a booking, at least 72 hours or more BEFORE your departure. All travelers entering Nunavik from the South will be required to present proof of a negative test performed at least 72 hours before departure.
3	 Meet with a nurse for screening procedures The NRBHSS requires that all departing passengers be screened by a nurse at the airport prior to departure. Passengers connecting from other airlines must present themselves at the check-in counter on arrival so that they may meet with a nurse. Passengers who have not been screened by a nurse prior to departure will be denied boarding.
4	 Be prepared to wear a face mask throughout the flight Only quality masks are permitted for use to board and throughout a flight. Procedural face masks (3-ply blue) are available at the boarding gate for allpassengers aged 12 years and older.
5	 Know what to expect Visit our <u>CN Care page</u> to learn about the many safeguards we have implemented and what youcan expect during your flight.
